



## RURAL AND NORTHERN EDUCATION FUND (RNEF) SPENDING REPORT 2022-2023

In June 2017, the Ministry announced new funding effective September 2017, through the Grants for Student Needs (GSN), dedicated for school boards to further improve education for students from rural communities.

Funding was allocated to school boards based on the number of rural students and two factors measuring the density of rural student enrolment in the Board.

School boards must use the funding for rural education based on local needs and report publicly on how the funding is used, such as:

- Improving programming and support services in rural schools
- Continuing the operation of rural schools; or
- Enhancing student transportation options such as late bus runs and mobile e-learning through tablets or Wi-Fi

For 2022-2023, Trillium Lakelands District School Board received funds of \$1,269,588 and the funding was spent on improving programming and support services, and continuing the operation of rural schools as follows:
