# 7.1 Wahta Mohawks First Nation Update

- S. Chaloux and K. Taylor shared the following updates:
  - The Education Celebration for graduating students will take place on June 13, 2024.
  - Funding, formerly used to support Elders and Knowledge Holders in the classroom, was used this year to support land-based learning in Community, including hide tanning, lacrosse, forest walks and scavenging, leek harvesting, crafting, and more. Grade 8 Glen Orchard Public School classes participated in the programming. Wahta Mohawks hopes to include TLDSB students in water-based learning in the future.

## 7.2 TLDSB update

- J. Johnston shared the following updates:
  - Several Williams Treaty First Nations issued a public notice to City of Kawartha Lakes resident William Denby, who has been falsely claiming indigeneity and sharing misinformation in the area. Steps have been taken to prevent him from approaching students and staff on Board property.
  - A posting has been shared internally for a part time Indigenous mental health counsellor position.
  - Brittany Taylor of Curve Lake First Nation was recently recognized for a Director's Innovation Award for her work in schools.

- The 2024-2025 budget has been received and is under review by the Financial Services Department following the Ministry of Education's restructuring of funding.
- The Indigenous Student Success Team was thanked for their continued hard work.
