6.1 Wahta Mohawks First Nation Update

- Land based learning initiatives include cranberry harvesting, 2-day trapping, winter survival and teachings, maple syrup, leek harvesting, fish skin tanning, strawberry trainings, spring planting
- Swim tests for Grade % GLO students + 7 students from Grade 6/7 class
- Three pysch-ed assessments recognized with approvals
- Speech and Play therapy in school; update service agreement if needed
- Family Well Being; two new staff providing support for older and whole family well being
- After school tutoring available in literacy and math
- After school counselling services available by referral
- Communication languages classes; everyone is invited to participate
- Looking at on-line accredited Mohawk languages classes (in-person remains the priority)

Indigenous students and an increase in Authentic Voice classroom visits, resulting in increased school connections. The Final 2024-2025 Board Action Plan must be completed by October 31, 2025.
